The book for our October meeting is “The Right Way to Lose a War: America in an Age of Unwinnable Conflicts” by Dominic Tierney

For nearly a century, up until the end of World War II in 1945, America enjoyed a Golden Age of decisive military triumphs. And then suddenly, we stopped winning wars. The decades since have been a Dark Age of failures and stalemates-in Korea, Vietnam, Iraq, and Afghanistan-exposing our inability to change course after battlefield setbacks. In this provocative book, award-winning scholar Dominic Tierney reveals how the United States has struggled to adapt to the new era of intractable guerrilla conflicts. As a result, most major American wars have turned into military fiascos. And when battlefield disaster strikes, Washington is unable to disengage from the quagmire, with grave consequences for thousands of U.S. troops and our allies. Drawing on interviews with dozens of top generals and policymakers, Tierney shows how we can use three key steps—surge, talk, and leave-to stem the tide of losses and withdraw from unsuccessful campaigns without compromising our core values and interests. Weaving together compelling stories of military catastrophe and heroism, this is an unprecedented, timely, and essential guidebook for our new era of unwinnable conflicts. The Right Way to Lose a War illuminates not only how Washington can handle the toughest crisis of all battlefield failure—but also how America can once again return to the path of victory.

“The Island of Knowledge: The Limits of Science & the Search for Meaning” by Professor Marcelo Gleiser

A DVD presentation from the Skeptics Society Distinguished Lecture Series.

Do all questions have answers? How much can we know about the world? Is there such a thing as an ultimate truth? To be human is to want to know, but what we are able to observe is only a tiny portion of what's "out there." In "[The Island of Knowledge](#)", Dartmouth College astronomer and physicist Dr. Marcelo Gleiser traces our search for answers to the most fundamental questions of existence. In so doing he reaches a provocative conclusion: science, the main tool we use to find answers, is fundamentally limited. These limits to our knowledge arise both from our tools of exploration and from the nature of physical reality: the speed of light, the uncertainty principle, the impossibility of seeing beyond the cosmic horizon, the incompleteness theorem, and our own limitations as an intelligent species. Recognizing limits in this way, Gleiser argues, is not a deterrent to progress or a surrendering to religion. Rather, it frees us to question the meaning and nature of the universe while affirming the central role of life and ourselves in it. Science can and must go on, but recognizing its limits reveals its true mission: to know the universe is to know ourselves.

Trump promises (on numerous occasions) to repeal the law that prohibits pulpit politicking.

He has become the first presidential candidate to openly advocate for the repeal of the "Johnson Amendment." Jerry Falwell, Jr. was very pleased stating: "After 30 years of so-called conservative leaders who have been elected by evangelicals, none of them thought to advocate for the repeal of the Johnson Amendment, giving the evangelical leaders political free speech. ...He (Trump) thinks it is going to be a revolution in the Christian world."

Trump has also claimed that he has been persecuted by the IRS for his "strong Christ beliefs.

Congress is considering a bill to undermine this portion of the State/Church separation wall, a rider to appropriations bill H.R. 5485.
